## Class 2 Summer Term Curriculum Letter

Welcome to the final term in Class Two and hoping you all had a lovely Spring break. There is a lot of hard work ahead for the final term for all of us but I know, with lots of effort, we will have another enjoyable and successful end to the year.

Our creative topic this term is on 'Sports For All'. We will be using this wonderful theme across our curriculum.

### Homework

This will be given out every Friday online with 'My Maths'. Homework should be completed within one week online (paper copies available and please remember to call in if any concerns). In addition, I would ask that all children read at least 3 times a week. Children are free to change their books when necessary, although this is usually done on Friday. Children who need extra help with reading will be heard every week and we try to record this in planners. Whatever stage your child is at in reading please encourage reading for enjoyment and understanding and also to help them to develop research skills. Times tables tests and practise will also continue in addition to the above and children will be regularly tested in class.

In Literacy, Class Two will continue to look at grammar, punctuation, spellings and sentence work in addition to traditional poems and performance poetry, followed by, plays and play scripts based on 'The Witches' by Roald Dahl, a lovely opportunity for drama and performance and finally Non-Fiction work based on persuasive writing. Where we hope to write persuasive adverts for our favourite toys! As always I will continue to place a strong emphasis on handwriting and presentation. Every child will practise school cursive handwriting and be encouraged to take pride in their work.

In Numeracy we will be working hard again in all areas of basic maths, focusing on addition/ subtraction, multiplication/ division, fractions, time, areas and shape. Children will be working towards securing and applying basic skills and applying their knowledge to mental maths and challenges. I would encourage all children to practise times tables and extend their knowledge to corresponding division facts. Your support at home with homework or extra work is always appreciated.

Every child will be asked to complete a project at home on a given topic. This term the children will focus their project on 'Sporting People' and will be given a date in which to present their topic to the class over the next few weeks. This can be done in any chosen way and does not have to be by PowerPoint. Sketches, handmade artefacts, posters or fact sheets are welcomed. The purpose of the project is to give the children a chance to extend their own learning and present their work back to the class, thereby encouraging their speaking and listening skills.

In R.E we will be looking at the new Diocese plans and we will also continue to follow our Class Worship themes each week. PHSE will focus on Relationships, My Body, Feelings and Self-Respect.

Design and Technology will be covered in fantastic Friday and each year group will have the opportunity to work with Mrs Banbury to design and construct with our Lego Mindstorm Kit and complete Stem Challenges. We will be also be looking at healthy life styles and foods in DT with Miss Davison. Art will now be covered in Fantastic Friday.

Our ICT will begin with a class theme of 'Digital Artists', exploring and using software under the control of the teacher to create, store and edit digital content using appropriate file and folder names.

P.E this term will be on Monday, with swimming in the morning and also on Thursday's, where we will continue to follow Lancashire plans for Striking and Fielding games.

This term we will continue to study French as part of our Modern Foreign Languages using Light bulb French and addressing; greetings, family and numbers. Music will be taught by Mrs Millward following our continuing music programme. Children also have the opportunity to have lessons in guitar and singing with outside agency teachers.

Our humanities focus is History this term, where we will be travelling back in time and exploring the question, 'How unpleasant were the Bronze and Iron ages?' and in Geography asking, 'Can you come on a great American road trip?' Looking closely at America, learning about the names of the cities, the country and state they are in, identifying, and writing down geographical information about these cities.

Another exciting and fun term to look forward to. Once again thank you for all your support and I look forward to another successful year in Class Two.
