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Mental Maths

Mr Goostry wants all children to develop their understanding of the importance of mental calculations and making 'jottings'. This year he wants the JLT to work closely with him to develop mental maths games and come up with ideas as to how we can develop mental maths across the school. Mr Goostry also wants to see in every classroom the use practical resources to aid calculations and to support children that are visual learners.

STEM Challenges
