Dear Class One, September 2022

I hope you all had a lovely Summer break and are ready for a new year and a new start.

Our intention is to make this Autumn Term an exciting one, full of learning for you whilst keeping everyone safe. Please can we also ask that children in KS1 only bring in their book bag into school each day. Our cloakroom is only small, and we are conscious winter coats will soon be a priority for this space.

PE day is on a Monday. Children **do not need** to bring their PE bag into school, they should come into school on Monday's ready.

The PE kit includes:

- A Singleton PE white t-shirt or a polo white t-shirt
- Singleton school jumper/cardigan
- Red shorts (in winter these can be replaced by **black** joggers / leggings)
- Trainers or pumps
- All earrings must be taken out before the PE day. Children must not wear earrings for PE. If the child cannot remove the earrings, they will be exempt from that lesson.

School Timetable:

The school timetable will be packed full of wonderful, enriched opportunities to learn and we look forward to lots of fun ahead. We are teaching a full timetable this year, with lots of exciting topics and chances to engage and learn new skills to ensure that we have a broad and balanced curriculum.

Literacy:

This term, we will be using an exciting new scheme in English in which we are teaching through a text. The children will have an opportunity to explore narrative settings through the story 'Cave Baby', by Julia Donaldson and Emily Gravett. We will also be exploring labels, captions and informal letters. We then move on to adventure stories, writing letters, diaries, sequels, persuasive letters and non-chronological reports using the 'Naughty Bus', by Jan Oke and Jerry Oke. Other books we will use over the term include: -

- The journey home
- We are water protectors
- Astro Girl
- Toys in space

Spelling lists will be given out each Friday (starting Friday 16th September) and tested the following week.

Phonics:

Phonics, as always, will be a huge focus and again we are using another new scheme. We will be using lots of different games and activities to make the children's learning as fun and engaging as possible. We are looking forward to using all our lovely new resources which will support and meet every learning style. Please can you

ensure that your child reads every night as this will very much support in their phonetical development, fluency, comprehension and writing.

Numeracy:

In Numeracy children will be working towards securing and applying skills and applying their knowledge to mental maths and challenges in the following areas.

Autumn 1

- Place Value 1
- Place Value 2
- Money
- Understand the operation of + -
- Measures & time

Autumn 2

- Properties of number
- Ordering / + -
- X ÷
- Money
- Shape

I would encourage all Year Two children (and Year One children if you feel they are ready) to practise their times tables daily.

Science:

Our initial topic will be the seasons (and we will return to this each term to compare the changes). We will then move into studying materials and their properties

Topic:

In Geography, we will be looking at our local area looking at weather patterns, physical and human features this will also include map work.

In History we will be looking at family history recognising the distinction between past and present and identifying some similarities and differences. We will also be developing an understanding of chronology.

RE:

In RE, we will be looking at the Bible and why it's a special book followed by God and the creation and then after half term Christmas. Reflecting on why we give and receive gifts.

PHSE: We will be following the Coram Education Scheme in PHSE and looking at Me and My relationships, exploring our feelings and friendships. After half term we will be looking at valuing differences thinking about how we make others feel alongside British Values.

Computing: We will be learning through Purple Mash platform and Project Evolve. Our first topic is online safety, and how we can use the use the internet to communicate safely. We will also be developing an understanding of how to effectively and safely search the internet

Fantastic Friday: Art will be taught in class and the children will look at Sculpture and 3D. After half term they will explore DT, looking at Food and Vegetables.

Music – we will be exploring music within the context of the Nativity, The children will be focusing on Performance, pitch, listening, dynamics and tempo

PΕ

In the autumn term the focus will be on basic skills which will include: - throwing, bouncing, rolling, kicking and catching balls. After half term the children will explore dance and movement

Important information:

- Book changing day is **MONDAY**. Your child will be allocated **x 2 books** per week. One of these will be a choice book and one from our reading scheme.
