#### **Dinner Money**

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### **Extra-Curricular Activities**

#### Information about PE and Extra-Curricular activities

- Please make sure that your child has additional kit for any after school activity, as P.E. Kit must not be worn.
- It is important that for sports such as football and hockey your children have the
  correct kit (clearly labelled with the child's first and last name) as these clubs will
  always take place outdoors (e.g. Football boots, shin pads, waterproof etc.)—
  Please ask Mrs James if you are unsure what your child needs.
- Mrs Stansfield will oversee the smooth running of the clubs and ensure that children are passed over to parents/ carers at the end of the session.
- All children attending extra-curricular clubs should be collected from Class 3's door. Please pick up your child promptly at 4.15pm after clubs.
- Please make sure that you pay for clubs in advance. If this does not happen then
  your child will not be booked on the course. All payments are via the 'ParentPay'
  system.
- Please note that as we continue to receive the Sports Grant in the year 2023 / 24
  we will continue to supplement the cost of the extra-curricular activities once
  again this year. However due to increases in costs there will be a slight price
  increase to £3:00 per session (£4.50 for tennis).



### Your children get 14 weeks holiday a year!

There are **38 weeks** in the year when schools are open, and **14 weeks (175 days)** when families can visit family overseas; go on holiday; travel; pupils can work, take educational trips, attend non urgent medical appointments.....**So is your request for leave exceptional?** 







### When a Child Arrives Late:

- It interrupts concentration.
- It wastes valuable learning time.
- The teacher repeats information / instructions whilst others have to wait.
- The late child is at an immediate disadvantage because they may have missed important teaching points, missed discussions where ideas are shared and will be generally unsettled.
- Children feel stressed and anxious about having to walk into their lessons late, some children find being late very distressing.
- Please note school starts at 8:40 and the expectation is that all pupils enter school at this time.

### A polite reminder about drop off and collecting on time before / after school and after clubs.

- Parents will drop off / collect children (or arrange for this to happen) **punctually** if parents are late then the children will be placed in Kids Club and there will be a charge. Please note there is an expectation that you collect promptly at 3:15 (or 4:15pm if your child participates in an Extra Curricular activity).
- Late collection is monitored by Miss Manns (Family Learning Mentor).

# This month we are focusing on 'Online Sexual Harrassment'



Dame Rachel de Souza DBE Children's Commissioner for England undertook the largest ever survey of children – 'The big Ask'- to understand children's lives. The findings concluded that there were significant issued around sexualized bullying and child on child abuse and that most children wanted support and more importantly wanted the support to come from their parents or carers.

Talking to our children can be hard, we can feel uncomfortable, not just because of the sexual nature of the topic but also because our children know more about technology than we do. But children want to talk to their parents about this so it is important that as parents we have the knowledge to give the answers our children need.



# Did you know .....

- Over half of 11–13-year-olds have already seen pornography.
- Many children view porn unintentionally for the first time 62% of 11–13-year-olds say that their viewing of porn was mostly or more unintentional.
- Parents' perceptions of how much porn their children are watching does not match the reality: only 25% of parents think that their child has seen porn compared to 53% of children who have.

# **Primary School Applications**

### **Important dates**

The arrangements for the admission of pupils to primary schools in September 2024 will, as far as possible, conform to the following timetable.

- **1 September 2023** Apply from this date
  - School places are not allocated on a first come, first served basis. All applications received up to the closing date are given equal priority, but if you miss the deadline, a late application may reduce your chance of getting your preference of school.
- **15 January 2024** National closing date for primary applications (statutory).
  - During this period all applications are processed and all preferences are considered against the published admissions policy. Where there are more applications than places available, decisions are made as to which children should be offered the available places. We will liaise and exchange information with all other admission authorities including neighbouring local authorities. The allocation and offer of a primary school place is finalised.
- **16 April 2024** Offers issued to parents.

(The national offer date is 16 April, if this date falls on a weekend or a bank holiday, offers are sent the next working day).

If you are not happy with an initial offer, the appeals period starts from your receipt of the offer. <u>Appeal information</u> will be issued later as this allows some time for reserve lists to operate.

Appeals which we receive after the deadline will be slotted into the schedule where possible. We cannot guarantee this however, and late appeals may have to be heard after the agreed date at a second round of hearings. The schedule is subject to change depending upon the availability of appeal panel members, clerks, venue, etc.
